Dermatologists diagnose, treat, and help prevent diseases or other conditions of the skin.

Entry routes:

To become a dermatologist, you'll need to complete speciality training.

Prior to starting your specialty training you need to have completed a medical degree. After your degree, speciality training can take between four and five years, depending on where you live.

If you have already made a decision to pursue a career in dermatology, try to get experience in the specialty or related areas such as genitourinary medicine, rheumatology, medical oncology, and immunology.

£59,346 - £74,979

Working hours: Most dermatologists work around eight to ten hours per day. A lot of that time will be spent having face-to-face discussions with patients and other staff
