Mobile Phone Reassertion



The below is taken from a recent publication and has stimulated a reassertion of our policy.

Mobile phone use to be banned in schools in England during the school day, including at break times, new guidance recommends.

Department for Education and **The Rt Hon Gillian Keegan MP** - Published 2nd October 2023.

Mobile phone use should be banned in schools across England to improve behaviour, the Education Secretary Gillian Keegan announced today. New guidance from the Department for Education will back head teachers in banning mobile phone use throughout the school day, including at break times, to tackle disruptive behaviour and online bullying while boosting attention during lessons. It aims to support the wider work the government is doing to raise standards in schools by increasing students' focus and reducing distractions.

The move will bring England in line with other countries that have already implemented a ban, including France, Italy, and Portugal. It follows warnings from the United Nations on the risks of smartphones in schools and government data that found around a third (29%) of secondary school pupils reported mobile phones being used when they were not supposed to in most, or all, lessons. If schools fail to implement the new guidance, the government will consider legislating in the future to make the guidance statutory.

Windsor High School and Sixth Form Response

Following the above planned ban of mobile phones in all English schools, Windsor High School and Sixth Form wishes to make our position very clear for all students, parents, and carers alongside a reassertion of procedures. At present the ban is not in place and we will allow students to bring phones to school as previously was the case as we know parents/carers enjoy the reassurance of being able to communicate with their child to and from school.

Students will be allowed a grace period regarding their phones leading up to half term, but there will be zero tolerance on our return from the half term holiday.

To be clear, phones should not be seen or heard at all within the school gates.

This includes: at any time in the day including before and after school, anywhere on the school grounds/within the school gates – something we have described as phones not being allowed to be seen or heard anywhere from "gate to gate". When handing phones in for PE this is encouraged but if the phone is turned on it will be confiscated.

Phones confiscated will be returned after school via Mr Morley but if it is repeatedly seen/heard and therefore confiscated parents/carers may need to collect the phone.



Kooth.com is an online emotional wellbeing and mental health platform, accredited by the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy (BACP).



Kooth is available 365 days a year providing free and anonymous access to preventative, early interventions and out-of-hours professional support which complements the treatment available via other mental health services. Kooth offers anonymous and free access to mental health and emotional wellbeing support, available to varying age ranges depending on the area they are commissioned in. In Sandwell and Walsall, Kooth is commissioned for 11-25 year olds and in Dudley is commissioned for 11-18 years old.
