End of Term (Friday 22nd December – Early Finish) and Spring Term Information



On Friday 22nd December 2023, the finish time for all students is 12.30pm. Students will have an extended break time and Free School Meal money will be available to spend during this time.

If your circumstances have changed recently and you are now in receipt of benefits such as Universal Credit and Income Support, then you may be entitled to apply for Free School Meals for your child. Free School Meal Vouchers

As per the recent Government directive Free School Meal vouchers are to be issued to families for the Christmas break. The vouchers are for £10 per week, therefore you will be receiving a voucher for £20 per eligible child.

The process is unchanged and vouchers will be sent for eligible students on **Monday 18th December 2023.**

If you are new to receiving Free School Meals the process is as follows:



- **Step 1** Click on the link received from <u>evouchers.com</u>.
- **Step 2** Enter your email address or mobile number to claim your voucher.
- **Step 3** Confirm your details if you are new to Evouchers, to create your account.
- **Step 4 -** You will then be sent a secure login link to your email address to verify your email.
- Step 5 Click on the link within your email.
- Step 6 Choose the retailer you would like your voucher
- for. Please note once selected this cannot be changed.
- Step 7 Click 'View Voucher'.
- **Step 8** You now have your voucher to be spent in your supermarket of choice.


Windsor Communications Parent/Carer Charter





On 30th November, 40 Year 10 students travelled to Aachen in Germany to visit the European Christmas markets. The students ventured into the heart of Aachen for a guided tour of the city. The tour provided insights into Aachen's rich history, including an exploration of the cathodral.





World Arabic Day - Monday 18th December 2023

The MFL Department is proud that we offer Arabic GCSE to so many of our Year 10, Year 11 and Year 13 students. Thank you to our fantastic teacher of Arabic, Mrs Redman. As part of our celebration for World Arabic Day on Monday there will be a special lunchtime club in A5 - a fun introduction to Arabic, open to students in Years 7, 8 and 9. Here are some phrases that students could learn to pronounce in the special lunchtime club on Monday:

كيف حالك؟ ?How are you مرحبًا

Students can also gather some interesting facts about Arabic during World Arabic Day. For example:

- Arabic is one of the most widely spoken languages in the world, used daily by more than 400 million people. It has nearly 300 million native speakers. It is the sixth most spoken language in the world. It is also the language of the Quran, which is the holy book of the Islamic faith.
- There are 25 countries that claim Arabic as an official or co-official language. Examples include: Algeria, Chad, Egypt, Jordan, Morocco, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Tanzania, Tunisia, United Arab Emirates and Yemen.
- It is the liturgical language in many churches in the Arab world. This means that Christian rituals are celebrated there in Arabic. And a significant part of the Jewish cultural and religious heritage was written in Arabic.
- It has a unique sound that doesn't exist in any other language (Dād)[i]: it is the fifteenth letter of the Arabic alphabet. It is very unusual to speakers of European languages. It can be described as a very strongly pronounced 'D'. For this reason, Arabic is called "the language of the Dād".
