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To ensure we are supporting all of our students in school, we have implemented duties and support in the KS3 girls toilets. Students across Years 7, 8 and 9 are allowed to use the central KS3 toilets, Year 10 and 11 students are not allowed to use, enter or approach these toilets. They should be using the Austen KS4 toilets.

To support this practice, we have limited numbers in the toilet to a maximum of 15 students allowed in at one time during break and lunchtime. This is the same practice for the boys KS3 toilets too - only Year 7, 8, 9 students should be using the boys KS3 toilets and KS4 students in Years 10 and 11 will be directed to Austen toilets.

Any KS4 students seen or found in the central KS3 toilets will have an immediate Refocus sanction. Should they repeatedly ignore this rule they will also be likely to face a suspension for their persistent disruptive behaviour and defiance. We appreciate your support in reinforcing this message to your child.

## Reminder: System for Lateness

A polite reminder that we introduced a new system last year regarding lateness. Lateness can be classed as:

- Students who arrive after 8:40am (they are officially late to school).
- Students who are arriving late to lessons (officially after the majority of other students have entered the classroom).


Students who arrive at school after 8:40am are required to sign in at the Science foyer between 8:40am and 9:10am. This will result in a 30 minute lunch-time detention. Students who are late to two or more lessons in a day will attend a 30 minute detention after school on the same day. We appreciate your support in ensuring we maintain our high expectations.

## Dudley Holiday Activities

With only four weeks until the Easter holidays, Dudley Council are running a government funded programme called the Holiday Activity and Food Programme that offers free activities during the school holidays for children aged 5-16 who receive free school meals.

You're eligible to register for the holiday activities programme (HAF) if the following applies: You live in Dudley or your child goes to school in the Dudley Borough, your child is aged between 5 and 16 years and your child is eligible for benefits related free school meals (FSM).

## Free School Meal Vouchers

As per the recent Government directive Free School Meal vouchers are to be issued to families for the Easter holidays. The vouchers are for $£ 10$ per week, therefore you will be receiving a voucher for £20 per eligible child. The process is unchanged and vouchers will be sent for eligible students on Wednesday 20th March 2024.

If you are new to receiving Free School Meals the process is as follows:
Step 1 - Click on the link received from evouchers.com.
Step 2 - Enter your email address or mobile number to claim your voucher.
Step 3 - Confirm your details if you are new to Evouchers, to create your account.
Step 4 - You will then be sent a secure login link to your email address to verify your email.
Step 5 - Click on the link within your email.
Step 6 - Choose the retailer you would like your voucher for. Please note - once selected this cannot be changed.
Step 7 - Click 'View Voucher'.
Step 8 - You now have your voucher to be spent in your supermarket of choice.
