Information from Dudley Council Health Protection Department

Measles cases are rapidly rising across the West Midlands. Read more about symptoms here: NHS-measles. If you have not had any measles vaccinations you can get the MMR vaccine. The MMR vaccine is safe and gives effective protection against measles infection. If children and adults have missed these vaccinations in the past, it's important to take up the vaccine now.

Your GP surgery can advise if you are unsure of your or your child's vaccination status. It's never too late to get vaccinated against measles. Protection against measles starts to develop around two weeks after having the MMR vaccine.

If there are pregnant staff in a workplace who are unvaccinated, they would be especially vulnerable to the serious effects of measles infection. For those who are concerned for religious reasons about the vaccine, there is a non-porcine gelatine version of the MMR available for anyone who would prefer this. KS3 Toilets



To ensure we are supporting all of our students in school, we will be working on duties and support in the KS3 girls toilets. Students across **Years 7**, **8** and **9** are allowed to use the central KS3 toilets, **Year 10** and **11** students are **not allowed to use**, **enter or approach these toilets**. **They should be using the Austen KS4 toilets**.

To support this practice, we will limit numbers in the toilet to a maximum of 15 students allowed in at one time during break and lunchtime. This is the same practice for the boys KS3 toilets too only Year 7, 8, 9 students should be using the boys KS3 toilets and KS4 students in Years 10 and 11 will be directed to Austen toilets.

Any KS4 students seen or found in the central KS3 toilets will have an immediate Refocus sanction. Should they repeatedly ignore this rule they will also be likely to face a suspension for their persistent disruptive behaviour and defiance.

We appreciate your support in reinforcing this message to your child and ensuring we are working together to support our wider school environment. Thank you in advance for your support.

and Guitar group will recommence, on Monday lunchtimes in E22.



One in three 8 year olds in Britain own a smartphone and that proportion rises to more than 90% by the time children reach 12 years old.

This concerted increase driven by factors both personal (blossoming independence) and practical (the transition to secondary school) - makes it all the more valuable for young people to know how to use such devices safely.

Dr Frost Maths is an online learning platform that is used at Windsor High School and Sixth Form to set maths homework and classwork tasks. The platform can also be used for independent study or revision.

How can I use Dr Frost to help with Maths and earn points?

- Complete homework and classwork tasks set by your teacher.
- 'Start a Practice' independently.



- Clean up Task of questions you've previously got wrong.
- By Topic to practice a certain Key Skill
- Times tables to brush up on your mental arithmetic.
- Past Papers for Years 10 and 11 preparing for GCSE.
- Ask your maths teacher if you are unsure of your login or what maths to work on.
