

# History Book Plug

Whilst learning about History, we come across some brilliant books that really engage readers and that help bring History to life! Below are some our recommendations:



#### Respect, by Michaela Morgan

Walter Tull was a true hero. He had to fight against racism on the pitch as one of the first black professional footballers in the UK. Then he faced the greatest fight of his life on the battlefield during the First World War.

### The Battle of Cable Street, by Tanya Landman

When Adolf Hitler was rising to power in Germany in the 1930s, the world was going through the Great Depression: mass unemployment across the world meant people were desperate.

Hitler promised jobs...but for German people only, and began spreading hatred against immigrants and Jewish people.

The Battle of Cable Street is set in London in the 1930s. It's about the rise of Oswald Moseley, a friend of Hitler, told through the eyes of Elsie, an Irish immigrant child. Would Britain go the same way as Nazi Germany, or would the British stand up and fight against hatred?

With more than 150 million subscribers worldwide, Disney+ has enjoyed a steady rise in popularity since launching four years ago: the platform's deep library of treasured old-school animated favourites, modern classics and original series means that it can offer a rich seam of engrossing content that caters for young and not-so-young users alike.



Of course, a consequence of this approach is the presence of the sort of age-inappropriate material one might not expect to find on the platform, given Disney's fabled status as a purveyor of family entertainment.

Please note, the above sessions are IN ADDITION to the whole school revision programme.


Reminder: Plastic cups are no longer available
